Boys bully more than girls			
Bullies are insecure and have low self-esteem			
Bullies don't have friends

Victims should ignore bullying behaviors			
Bullies don't mean to hurt victims, it's just fun.			
Victims can usually stop the bullying themselves if they fight back			
Other children should stay away from the bully-victim situation or they will get bullied as well			
Victims usually bring the trouble on themselves			
Learning disabled students are often victimized.			
Keeping the bullying a secret helps the bully			
Telling on a bully will only make the situation worse for the victim			
Girls and boys generally report equivalent levels of victimization, but girls report less direct bullying			
Bullying does not happen in circles of friends			
Spreading rumors is a form of bullying			
Generally, "intervenors" (people who help the victim) tend to be bigger than the bully			
Intervenors should threaten or intimidate the bully to stop the bullying			
Bullying is a problem between two people.			
Teachers intervene often to stop bullying.			
Teachers and parents need help from students to know about the extent of bullying.
